Fayette County Sheriff's Investigators have made two arrests on December 3, 2010 in connection with a home invasion which occurred earlier that day. Investigators are not yet releasing the identity of those individuals due to the ongoing investigation.

On December 3, 2010 at approximately 9:30 AM Fayette County Sheriff's Office Deputies responded to a possible home invasion in progress at a residence on Kimberly Court in south Fayette County. When deputies arrived at the residence they discovered three adult victims had been handcuffed and robbed at gunpoint.

The victims told investigators that earlier that morning between 9:00 AM and 9:30 AM four suspects approached the front door of the residence on Kimberly Court and identified themselves as being law enforcement officers. The four suspects then entered into the home where they proceeded to handcuff the three victims. The criminal act continued as the four suspects produced handguns while assaulting the victims and stealing items of value from inside the residence before fleeing the scene. The victims were able to give Fayette investigators a possible suspect vehicle description of a white newer model Chevrolet Impala. None of the victims were injured during this incident.

Fayette County Dispatchers transmitted a BOLO on the white newer model Chevrolet Impala to all Fayette County law enforcement agencies to include surrounding jurisdictions. At approximately 10:00 AM Fayette County Sheriff's Deputies initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle matching the BOLO description on Hwy 74 and Tyrone Road in west Fayette County.

The vehicle was occupied by two individuals who matched the suspect description from the home invasion on Kimberly Court. The two vehicle occupants were later positively identified by the victims in this case and were taken into custody by Fayette investigators. While searching the suspect vehicle investigators located several items that had been reported stolen during the home invasion.

Both suspects are currently in the Fayette County Jail where criminal charges are pending. This is an active criminal investigation.
