Fayette County Sheriff's investigator's made an arrest on August 24 in connection with an identity theft case which occurred on August 3, 2010. Investigators have obtained warrants for Jasmyne Jordan, 21, of Decatur and charged her with Identity Fraud. Jordan is currently in the Fulton County Jail on unrelated charges.

This case involved Jordan unlawfully cashing a stolen check at a Delta Community Credit Union bank in Atlanta which belonged to a Fayette County citizen.

Fayette County Sheriff's investigators made an arrest on August 25 in connection with a theft case which occurred on August 24, 2010. Investigators have arrested Brandon Adams, 27, of Griffin and charged him with Theft by Taking.

This case involved Adams stealing a Samsung cellular telephone from a Fayette residence while doing contract construction work at the victim's home. The cellular telephone was recovered by Fayette investigators and returned to the victim.

Fayette County Sheriff's investigators made an arrest on August 11 in connection with a theft by receiving case which occurred on August 10, 2010. Investigators have arrested Michael Crump, 23, of Atlanta and charged him with Theft by Receiving Stolen Property.

This case involved Crump being found in possession of a stolen air conditioner pump which had been reported stolen out of Newnan on August 10, 2010.

Fayette County Sheriff's investigators made an arrest on August 26 in connection with a theft by deception case which occurred on August 20, 2010. Investigators have arrested Christopher Dale Collins, 37, of Senoia and charged him with Theft by Deception.

This case involved Collins fraudulently obtaining store credit from Stein Mart in Fayette County after knowingly returning stolen merchandise that had been reported stolen from a Stein Mart delivery truck on August 19, 2010.
